
Since 1944, Bethany has been equipping families to be the answer for children in need. We do this in more than 120 offices across the United States and in more than 15 countries.



In the U.S., we provide counseling and support for expectant parents facing unplanned pregnancies. We create and nurture families through adoption and postadoption services, foster care, family counseling, refugee services, and our Safe Families for Children™ ministry.

Globally, we are pioneering in-country foster care and adoption programs that keep children in families, in their own communities, rather than in institutions. Our international adoption programs specialize in finding families for older children, sibling groups, and children with special needs. We also offer Global Consulting services to churches and organizations looking to implement a family–based approach to orphan care.

In all we do, we are inspired and led by our faith to show God's love to those who are close to His heart.



mmy's life hadn't turned out the way she'd hoped. Pregnant, alone, and with no financial stability, she felt mentally and emotionally broken—hardly in a position, she thought, to bring a child into the world. She assumed abortion was her only choice.

A friend introduced her to Bethany. She found practical help and support without judgment. There she talked to a counselor who told her Bethany could offer other options if she wanted to know more.


Ammy enrolled in counseling classes and—for the first time—she began to see new doors open and set new goals for her life. She began to feel whole.

hen MacArthur and Terreon married, adoption was one of the first things they discussed. They didn't know a lot about open adoption, but after attending a Bethany training class, they were interested in pursuing that option so their child would also know their birthfamily.

In their 40s and seeking to adopt a baby, the couple wondered if a birthmother would choose them. But when Keaira first met them, she could see they would be loving, down-to-earth parents for her son. Knowing she could still have a relationship with her son gave Keaira the confidence to choose adoption.

"The first thing MacKinley does when he wakes up in the morning is smile, and it just makes my whole day," MacArthur said. "Being a parent is an awesome feeling."

MacArthur and Terreon want MacKinley's birthmother to share in this joy, too, and their open adoption relationship allows that to happen. "We went in with one perception of what adoption would be like, and we tried to stay positive," Terreon said, "but we never-in-a-million-years thought it would be this positive."




obert's early childhood was marked by a series of legal guardianships, foster care placements, and residential care. By the age of 15, he had all but dropped out of school and assumed he wouldn't live to see 18. A brush with juvenile detention, and help from a caring therapist, sparked his desire to make better choices. For the first time, he started thinking about his future.

Since 2007, Doug and Missi had been foster parents for mostly young children. In 2012, they sensed God calling them to open their home to an older teen. In their home, Robert found the structure and stability he needed to get back on track at school. His grades improved and he made friends. After 12 foster placements, Robert was finally home with his forever family.

Robert not only lived to see 18, but he celebrated the day with family and friends. Later that year, they celebrated his adoption. This is the difference a family can make.


A fter 15 years of marriage, two children, and years of volunteer work with orphanages abroad, Keith and Kristy sensed God gently working in their hearts. In time they understood—He was calling them to adopt a child with special needs.

"We started by speaking with a Bethany adoption specialist, and we felt God's Spirit telling us to trust Him," said Kristy. What followed were "random" emails, videos, and texts about Down syndrome. Kristy looked at Keith and said, "I think we can do this."

Kristy and Keith received a Caring Connection grant that allowed them to adopt not one, but two children. After living apart in foster families in Hong Kong, twins Elijah and Malachi are now together in a loving forever family.

"People say our boys are 'lucky' to have us, but we are the ones blessed beyond measure," Kristy said. "Elijah and Malachi love unconditionally in a way that I admire and desire to show others."

In 2012, Yordanos was an excellent student who loved to read, sing, and express herself artistically. She was living with her mother, grandmother, uncle, and younger brother in one of the poorest areas of Ethiopia. Her father had passed away, and her mother's chronic illness made it impossible for her to work. The family subsisted on the wages her uncle earned as a security guard.

Bethany's One Family sponsorship ministry covered the cost of school fees and supplies for Yordanos and her brother. It also provided food and basic health care for the family. The additional monthly support not only kept this family together, but it also kept this family's spirit alive. For the first time they could imagine a different life, and they finally had the resources to live into that new reality.

Within three years, Yordanos' uncle found additional work to supplement his income. They also acquired rental property to bring in a little more. Yordanos has completed her first year of college. An accomplished artisan, she dreams of starting her own business to sell her original cloth designs.

This family emerged stronger, self-sufficient, and positioned to reinvest in their community.
