They received a call about a young boy who had been born blind in his left eye. Their oldest daughter had also been born blind in her left eye, and they knew right then God had prepared them for this. A few months later, Theo's sisters and brother welcomed him home.

Bethany's Caring Connection fund provided assistance with Theo's adoption and his medical needs. He will be fitted for a prosthetic eye this year, and his sister is excited to mentor him on how to protect his seeing eye. She was thrilled that God brought her a brother just like her.

orn in Rwanda, Benoit spent years living in refugee camps in the Democratic Republic of Congo and the Central African Republic. He was always at the top of his class in school, but he didn't have parents to pay his tuition or support his efforts. When his teachers told him he likely wouldn't finish, he was desperate to prove them wrong. "Somehow I knew success was coming," he said, "but I didn't know how to achieve it. I had hopes for a new life in the U.S."

Benoit was 17 when he was resettled with a foster family in Michigan. He went from living in constant chaos and danger to a safe home where he had his own room. That tangible sense of security gave him a foundation he could build on. "I learned what a family is and how it operates," he said. "I had siblings that referred to me as their brother. I had a dad who taught me how to shave and how to drive a car. I was able to continue my education. I never would have experienced these things otherwise."

Ten years later, Benoit is a college graduate and a U.S. citizen. He is also a youth specialist with Bethany's Transitional Living Center in Grand Rapids, and he is giving back at Bethany by helping other refugee youth. "I am so grateful, and that's why I came back to work at Bethany, to help other refugee youth just like me. I want them to know they have support and a bright future ahead," he said. "The sky is the limit."

hen Sloan and Dustin inquired about becoming foster parents to two brothers, 15-month-old Zion and 4-week-old Triumphant, they had no idea what the future held. Fostering brought challenges as Sloan and Dustin learned how to love strongly but hold on loosely.

Within a few months, they learned the boys' mother was expecting a third child who would enter foster care at birth. "We asked God to show us if we could care for two very young children and a newborn," said Sloan. "With support from our family, friends, and church, God provided all we needed—and then some."

Sloan and Dustin welcomed baby Noah into their home where he met his two brothers. After two years as foster parents, they became adoptive parents to Zion, Triumphant, and Noah. "We went through some crazy, hard times together," said Sloan. "Our boys are now five, six, and seven. They are all in school and thriving in life. Currently they have a love for Star Wars, music, sports, playing outside, and wrestling! We are so abundantly blessed by them and we consider it pure joy."

s a 21-year-old college student, Ashley* never thought she would experience an unplanned pregnancy. She was scared and unsure what to do next. Those close to her encouraged her to have an abortion, even offering her money to go through with it. But as an adoptee herself, Ashley made a life-affirming decision to create an adoption plan. She met with a Bethany counselor who helped her build a support system and a future for her unborn child.

"Cindy was there to answer my questions and my 3:00 a.m. phone calls," Ashley said. "She helped me look through waiting family profiles and think about what I wanted my child to have in a family."

During this time, an unexpected health condition forced Ashley to quit her job. She didn't know how she would support herself and receive needed medical care.

Through Bethany's Life Impact Fund, Ashley was able to receive the assistance she needed to pay rent and utilities, allowing her to make the best decisions about her pregnancy.

At seven months pregnant, Ashley had chosen an adoptive family for her unborn child, but she still had doubts whether she was making the right decision. "I just prayed, 'Lord, I'm losing my mind. Please help me!" she said. "Within minutes, I felt a calming peace."

Today, her son, Sam, is a happy boy full of laughter and smiles. Ashley's relationship with his adoptive family continues to grow, and she loves hearing from them and receiving photos.

Kerline is healthy and happy with the love and support of her foster family. Jean and Samuel love caring for Kerline and are very committed to her. They feel blessed to provide a safe, long-term home for her.
